What is an Official Plan?

Bayham Official Plan

- Contains goals, objectives and policies to direct physical and land use change and their effects on the cultural, social, economic and natural environment within Bayham.
- Maps (or "Schedules") used to identify specific land use designations that apply to each parcel of land.
- Implements Provincial policies and guidelines


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What is an Official Plan Review?

- The Planning Act requires municipalities to update their Official Plan every five (5) years so that it:
 - 1. Is consistent with the Provincial Policy Statement.
 - 2. Has regard to the matters of provincial interest.
 - 3. Conforms with the upper-tier (Elgin County) Official Plan.
- Opportunity to address local priorities and changing community needs.



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What is an Official Plan Review? (Continued)

- County of Elgin Council adopted the new Elgin County Official Plan on May 14, 2024, and is being reviewed by the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing for approval.
- Ongoing Provincial legislation that our team will take into consideration for the project.

What does this mean for Bayham?

- Bayham Official Plan Review is to ensure the new Bayham Official Plan conforms with the proposed adopted Elgin County Official Plan.
- Should reduce timing in Bayham's Official Plan Review process ('big picture' work completed by Elgin County).
- Opportunity to create a robust and modernized Bayham Official Plan.



4 Areas Anticipated to Change in the New Official Plan

The following provides four (4) examples of areas anticipated to change in the New Official Plan:

- 1. 'On-Farm Diversified Use and Agricultural-Related Use' Policies
- 'Settlement Area Boundary Adjustments or Land Swaps' depending on requests received.
- 3. 'Housing and Affordability' Policies mix of housing types to achieve housing affordability.
- 4. Modernized Schedules (Mapping)




4 Areas Not Anticipated to Change in the New Official Plan

The following provides four (4) *examples* of areas **not** anticipated to change in the New Official Plan:

- 1. 'Natural Heritage System' Mapping already completed by Elgin County.
- 2. 'Hazardous Lands' Mapping already completed by Elgin County.
- 3. 'Settlement Area Expansions' more specifically, no net increase in Settlement Area land.
- 4. 'Agricultural and Surplus Farm Dwelling Severance' Policies strict policies based on Provincial plans and legislation.



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
