



Notice of Construction Glen Erie Line (CR 42) Slope Stabilization

March 3, 2026

Dear Property Owner / Resident,

The County of Elgin is pleased to inform you that the slope stabilization and reconstruction of Glen Erie Line will commence this year. County Council has approved the low bid from Robert M. Simon Construction Ltd. of Waterford and work will be commencing shortly.

Project Details

Location: Glen Erie Line (County Road 42) from Plank Road to the County Limits at County Road 55

Schedule: Tree Removals – Week of March 9th to 20th
Tentative Construction Start Date – June 2026

Anticipated Completion: October 2026

Scope:

- Culvert replacements and rehabilitations
- Widening of over steepened banks
- Roadside safety feature improvements (new guardrail)
- Bank and creek restorations
- Replacement and repaving of driveway culverts

Transportation Impacts

Glen Erie Line will be closed throughout construction to local traffic only. Replacement of cross culverts (culverts which cross under Glen Erie Line) will facilitate a full closure of the roadway (residents will be informed by the contractor and consultant in advance). For your safety, please adhere to all signage, traffic control persons and directions from

the Contractor with respect to accessing your property. The Contractor will have a contingency plan in place for emergency services.

Property Impacts

Properties affected by the widening of the roadway side slopes have been informed due to the County requiring additional lands to facilitate the widenings. Access to your property may change depending on cross culvert replacements. Ensure any items (excluding mailboxes, 911 signs) are removed from the County right-of-way prior to construction to minimize damage to personal items.

If you have accessibility concerns with respect to property access or require special considerations throughout construction, please reach out to the Project Team to discuss potential arrangements.

Waste Collection Impacts

The Municipality of Bayham (Norfolk Disposal) will continue to collect garbage on the regularly scheduled day. Circular Materials will continue to collect recycling on the regularly scheduled day.

Please be cognizant of cart placement and note the Contractor may move carts and blue boxes during active collection to ensure waste continues to be collected and carts are not damaged – please ensure your blue boxes and garbage cart are identified with your address number prior to construction.

Construction Impacts

Traffic: Glen Erie Line to be closed to local traffic only. During full closures, follow posted detour routes. Posted detours will be noted on Municipal 511 with up-to-date information:

Water Impact: Water service will be maintained throughout the project. If a service disruption is required, you will receive advanced notice of this work. If you experience a water service disruption please contact the Project Team.

Vibration: Construction equipment can cause vibrations. Please ensure you protect any valuables susceptible to damage.

Plants, Landscaping, Sprinklers, Fencing, Personal Effects, etc.:

Please remove all decorations, plants and any other items on County property you wish to save in advance of construction. Work may be taken up to property line and the County is not responsible for damage or destroyed items located on County property.

The County right-of-way is generally defined by fire hydrants, telecommunication boxes and hydro poles. Please contact the Project Team if you are unsure or unaware of your property limits.

Driveway Restoration:

As part of construction, the removal of portions of your driveway may be necessary in order to complete the project. Your driveway will be repaired using asphalt placed to County standards.

Mail Delivery: Normal mail delivery will continue during construction.

Internet/Phone: If your internet or phone line service is disrupted during construction, it is best to call your provider directly and report an outage.
